 made this 28th day of May in the
 year of our Lord one thousand
 Eight hundred and thirty four, between
 James K. Hill Esqr Sheriff of the County
 of Duplin and State of North Carolina
 on the one part and John. S. James
 of the County of Duplin and State
 aforesaid upon the Land herein after
 described on the other part Whereas the
 public County & poor taxes to the amount
 of three dollars upon the Land herein
 after described were due for the years
 1830, 31, 32 & 1833 and collectable
 by the Sheriff aforesaid as also the sum
 of Two dollars for contingent charges
 allowed by Law and whereas the said
 James K. Hill Sheriff as aforesaid in
 pursuance and by virtue of his
 office
