ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good name in the community, is the direct descendant of an ancestor who was at all times entitled by his loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, yeoman, militia man, or militia man, in the several States of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence, or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence, or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature, or as a distinguished patriot who performed active service by great acts of valour in the capacity of Great Britain. — Constitution of National Society I. A. S., Article III, Section 1, adopted June 1, 1897, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original state; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one Revolutionary service, and it is desired to be admitted to the additional States, separate applications, in the form of "Supplemental Applications," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

State fully and accurately on traditional authority as you found the following record open, and also the evidence of descent, with date of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 1, 1911, the recipient of a certificate issued on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.
